

Chappeeela District Spring Cuboree

Everyone must be registered through the IAC Website at www.iacbsa.org to attend this event. Pack Leaders, Scouts, and Family Members must be registered online by **12 midnight on Friday, March 8, 2019** in order to qualify for the on-time fees. No registrations will be allowed after **March 15th, 2019** to ensure we can get everything ready for Saturday morning in a timely manner.

***LATE FEES:** A \$10.00 late fee per person will be assessed on all registrations received after the registration deadline, March 8, 2019. Patches might not be available for Late Packs.

***REFUND POLICY:** The following policy statement is applicable to all Council and District events where a fee is collected. This includes events such as District Day Camps, Cub Resident Camp, Summer Camp, Winter Camp, Cuborees, Camporees, Training Courses (Scoutmaster Fundamentals, OWLS, Wood Badge, etc.).

- Written refund requests will be considered only if received in the Pennington Scout Center 10 days prior to the stay at camp.
- Written refund submitted after the event will be considered only for personal illness or family emergencies. No refund requests will be accepted after 10 days following the close of camp.
- A service charge of 25% on the full activity fee will be assessed on all refunds.
- Refund checks will be issued within 30 days following the close of the event.
- Fees are only transferable within the same unit to a Scout not currently registered for the event.

Introduction

Join us for the Spring Cuboree/ AOL Crossover March 22, 23, 24 2019 at Louisiana Renaissance Festival Property on River Road in Hammond. This will be an adventure for the Packs and families that will test the skills of the Cub Scouts. Each Pack will be asked to help oversee a station during the day. Included will be the details for each of the stations. At least one of the stations will be scored with awards being given for the events.

Registration

Registration will be online by Pack Registration only at www.iacbsa.org. Cost for this event before 3/8/19 will be \$15 per Scout and \$10 per Adult and Sibling. Children under 5 years of age are free. On 3/8/19 the cost for this event will go up to \$25 per Scout and \$20 per Adult and Sibling. **NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO REGISTER AFTER 3/15/19.**

The Scout Office will not accept paper registrations or payments.

Check-In

Check in will begin Friday, March 22 at 4PM. Vehicles will be allowed in camping area, but Vehicles are to unload or drop supplies and return to the parking area. Per BSA rules no vehicles will be allowed to stay in the camping area. Camping assignments will be given at check in. There will be a twenty (20) minute time limit that will be enforced. Drivers Licenses will be asked for at gate to enter camping area to unload, but will be returned when vehicle comes back out to parking lot.

Mandatory Leader Meeting

There will be a mandatory Leader/Parent meeting at 9:30PM on March 22nd, Location TBD. Two leaders or Parents from each Pack are required to attend. Also, whoever is working an event will be required to attend. Final details about events will be discussed at this time.

General Rules

The Scout Law, Scout Oath and the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace are guiding rules for all Cuborees. All participants, both Scouts, Parents and Siblings are expected to follow the Oath and Law. All activities should be done by assigned groups unless otherwise noted.

Scoring and Score Cards

Each group will be assigned score cards for each event that is being recorded for ribbons and trophies. Persons in charge of the activity will write down score and turn them into committee members. Scores will be tallied Saturday afternoon and ribbons/trophies will be distributed at the Campfire Saturday evening 3/23/19.

Campfire Program and Skits

Campfire will begin at 6:30PM Saturday evening. All Dens of the Packs attending need to provide one skit or song. The more skits and songs the better the campfire program will be.

EVENTS/ACTIVITIES

1st Station: Jedi Training Course

Set-up and Rules: Adult running this course will be given the supplies and instructions on how to set this station up and run the station.

Solution: Get through the Training Course as fast/safely as you can to save yourself from the impending doom of the Death Star.

2nd Station: Atomic Ball Carry

Set-up and Rules: Scouts and siblings will be supplied with a platform with strings that are attached, and a rubber ball. They must use their communication skills to raise the ball from the ground to about waist high and bring it back to the ground without dropping the ball.

Solution: Help levitate a ball on a platform from the ground as a group. Communication between yourselves is the key.

3rd Station: Jedi Slime making

Set-up and Rules: Supply each Scout and sibling with a small container to store their Jedi Slime. Provide each Scout and sibling with supplies to make their slime. Instruct them with the recipe how to make their slime.

Solution: Make a small container of Jedi Slime that you are able to take home with you.

4th Station: Archery

Set-up and Rules: Archery will be Set-up and ran by the Range Master. Scouts must show safe use of Weapons and follow the instructions of the Range Master.

Solution: Learning Correct use of shooting weapons, and have FUN while learning how to do it.
