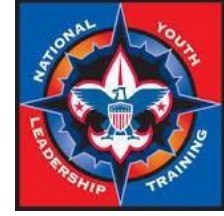

What is the NYLT Youth Staff's Job?

The NYLT youth staff is responsible for conducting the National Youth Leadership Training under the guidance of the Course Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters.

Who is Eligible?

To be considered for NYLT youth staff, a Scout must:

- Be at least 14 years old.
- Be a graduate of a NYLT course
- Has held, or will hold, a leadership position in a Troop or Crew
- Obtain a recommendation to serve on the youth staff from your Scoutmaster/Advisor and parents.
- Must be a youth of their respective program (under 18 for Boy Scouting and under 21 for Venturing)

What Will I Do?

As a youth staff member, you will serve in one of the following positions:

Senior Patrol Leader: As in any Scout troop, the Senior Patrol Leader is the key leader of an NYLT troop. He/she is empowered by the NYLT Scoutmaster to run the troop with the help of the rest of the youth staff and the NYLT Troop Guides.

Duties of the Senior Patrol Leader include:

- Running troop meetings, events, and activities
- Presenting Course Material
- Chairing meetings of the Patrol Leaders' Council
- Delegating duties and responsibilities to other members of the NYLT youth staff
- Assisting the Scoutmaster with staff training
- Modeling the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus
- Recruiting youth participants

Assistant Senior Patrol Leaders (3): The NYLT troop's Assistant Senior Patrol Leaders are prepared to fulfill the duties of the Senior Patrol Leader if he/she is unavailable at some point during a course. One Assistant Senior Patrol Leader will take responsibility for program matters, one will accept responsibility for service, and another will take responsibility for the Troop Guides' activity.

Duties of the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader for Program include:

- Mentoring & coaching to each day's program patrol
- Overseeing the preparation of campfires
- Presenting Course material
- Supporting NYLT presenters with preparations for sessions, meetings, and activities
- Overseeing audiovisual support for NYLT sessions

- Modeling the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus
- Completing other assignments as determined by the Senior Patrol Leader
- Recruiting youth participants

Duties of the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader for service include:

- Providing mentoring & coaching for each day's service patrol
- Overseeing preparations of the model campsite on the Orientation Trail (Day One of the NYLT course)
- Presenting Course material
- Conducting daily campsite inspections & guiding patrols in complying with the Daily Campsite Inspection Checklist
- Teaching the daily service patrols to police and clean up troop areas with a Leave No Trace ethic
- Manage presentations of the Baden-Powell Patrol streamers
- Completing other assignments as determined by the Senior Patrol Leader
- Recruiting youth participants

Duties of the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader for Troop Guides include:

- Providing mentoring & coaching for Troop Guides' activities and duties
- Presenting Course material
- Modeling the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus
- Completing other assignments as determined by the Senior Patrol Leader
- Recruiting youth participants

Troop Guides (6 to 8): The role of the NYLT Troop Guide is similar to that of the troop guide in a Scout troop. In addition, NYLT troop guides are key to facilitating the NYLT syllabus and advancing each patrol's development as a team.

Duties of a Troop Guide include:

- Serving the patrol to which he is assigned
- Coaching and mentoring each day's patrol leader
- Presenting selected sessions and activities of the NYLT course
- Modeling the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus
- Completing other assignments as determined by the Senior Patrol Leader
- Recruiting youth participants

Quartermaster (2-3): The role of the NYLT Quartermaster is similar to that of the Quartermaster in a Scout troop.

Duties of a Quartermaster include:

- Management of course equipment to patrols; including inventory management, distribution procedures
- Organization and distribution of food to patrols on daily basis
- Assist with food preparation for some course meals
- Modeling the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus
- Completing other assignments as determined by the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader for service
- Recruiting youth participants

Scribe: The role of the NYLT Scribe is similar to that of the troop guide in a Scout troop. In addition, NYLT Scribe produces the daily newsletter and updates the course Facebook page daily.

Duties of the Scribe include:

- Daily newsletter
- Facebook/ Social Media updates during the course
- Presenting selected sessions and activities of the NYLT course
- Modeling the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus
- Completing other assignments as determined by the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader for Program
- Recruiting youth participants

How much of a commitment will I have to make?

- Course Dates are May 26 – May 31, 2019 at Avondale Scout Reservation (ASR).
- Staff reports on May 25 by 9:00 AM and will be finished no later than June 1 at 1:00 PM. Attendance for the entire course is mandatory. The course does NOT interfere with IAC Summer Camp (staffing or camp) participation.
- Staff will have 3-4 weekends of training and preparation prior to the course. Attendance is required.

Staff Fee: \$75.00 youth / \$100 adult (covers food and costs during staff developments and course)

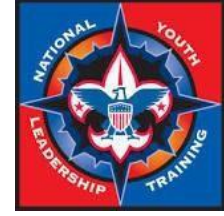

When do I apply?

- Apply early for the best chance to be selected for the 2019 program.
- Applications will be accepted until **January 25th**. If your application indicates you are qualified for NYLT staff, you may be invited to an interview with the NYLT Scoutmaster, Asst. Scoutmaster, Senior Patrol Leader and Asst. Senior Patrol Leader.

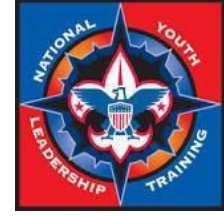
