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Focus of Cub Family Campout 2019

Cub Family Campout 2019 is to offer the Packs an opportunity to camp as a unit. Most youth join Cub Scouting because of the outdoor activities. Youth in this age group have a natural curiosity about their surroundings, especially the world out-of-doors. Introducing these youth to the fun and adventure of Scouting in the outdoors will benefit them as they mature through the program. Their participation and enthusiasm will grow for continuing in the program into Scouting and beyond.

Cub Family Campout Overview:

- Registration is all online by unit this year – there are no individual registrations.
- Online registration will open on Friday, August 30, 2019.
- On Time Fees are \$24/Scout and \$24/adult and \$24/sibling(s) who are over 5 years old and are not registered scouts. Siblings who are 5 years old and under are free.
- Late Registration starts on Thursday, September 19, 2019 and Late Fees will be \$30/Scout and \$30/adult and \$30/sibling(s) who are over 5 years old and are not registered scouts. Siblings who are 5 years old and under are free.
- Online registration will close on Saturday, September 28, 2019 at 11:59 pm. (See the Registration Section)
- Registration includes program supplies, meals (Sat. & Sunday) and a Cub Scout Family Campout Patch.
- Fees can be paid online with a Debit Card or Electronic Check (this is the preferred way).
- Some bathroom facilities will be designated **“Female Only”**.

Camp Rules and Regulations

- Fires can only be built in fire rings in your own campsites. Campfires **MUST be monitored at all times.**
- Do not cut live trees.
- Do not dig anywhere.
- Alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Fireworks and firearms are strictly prohibited.
- Camp is quiet after taps. No noise, minimal movement around camp.
- All BSA policies are followed.

Drive-In Procedures

Friday: **Camp will NOT be staffed.**

If your Pack/Dens wish to have a "family campout" on Friday night, they may, however the Cub Scout Family Campout does not officially open until Saturday morning. You are responsible for your own food on Friday Night.

BE AWARE OF CHILDREN PLAYING IN THE CAMPING AREA!

Friday and Saturday:

- Vehicles are not allowed in campsites.
- Vehicles may "drive-in" near their assigned campsite to drop off gear then move vehicle back to designated parking and continue setting up their gear.
- Pack trailers may be parked by the campsite, but NOT in the campsite and must be clear of the roadways. Upon entry to Camp Avondale and unloading their gear, drivers are to move their vehicle to the designated parking area/lot. Medical exceptions requiring a vehicle near the campsite shall be made prior to Cub Family Campout with the Cub Family Campout Chief.
- It will be the Cubmaster's responsibility to ensure that all vehicles in his/her Pack comply with this policy.

Sunday:

- Vehicles will be allowed in the camping area following dismissal (9:45 am)

Registration Information

Registration is by Pack only. No Individual Registration.

Each unit will make a single online registration with registration closing on Saturday, September 2, 2019 at 11:59 pm. Upon completion of the registration, online payment will be required in the form of a credit card payment or an electronic check. Please use the event registration on the Council website here <https://www.iacbsa.org> and log into your account. The link for Nashoba Cub Family Campout is on the left. See Below.

Cub Family Campout fee is \$24/Scout and \$24/adult and \$24/siblings (who is not a registered scout and is over 5 years old). Siblings who are 5 years old and under are free.

Each paying Scout and Scouter will receive a 2019 Cub Family Campout Patch.

Patches will be delivered at the Cub Family Campout.
