



# Nashoba Webelos Woods 2019 Leaders Guide

## General Info

**Date:** November 15-17, 2019      **Location:** Five Lakes Campground - Bush, LA

**Online Registration:** 21 October – 11 November

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## Troops Attending Webelos Woods

The following Troops have confirmed they will be attending Webelos Woods: 85, 100, 101, 110, 111, 119, 160, 310, 610, 611, and 8720. The following Troops have confirmed they will *not* be attending: 104, 164, 170, 172, 193, 221, and 270. The following Troops never replied to requests to find out if they were attending: 340

## Summary

Webelos Woods is designed to give Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts (WAoL Scouts) and their parents a small preview of the Scouts BSA (formerly called Boy Scouts) experience. The program reinforces Scouting values, procedures, methods and skills. It is an introduction to Scouts BSA being a “youth led” program versus the “adult led” program used in Cub Scouts. This is an excellent opportunity to help inspire WAoL Scouts to move into Troops and also provides Troops an opportunity to recruit new scouts.

## 2019 Changes from Previous Years and Highlights:

- Online registration: Units register online between 25 October and 11:30 pm, 10 November 2019. Troops and Packs will register separately with Packs picking which Troops to visit as part of their online registration process.
- While rotation time periods (Time Blocks) are 60 minutes in duration, the rotations are set up for a 45 minute visit time and 15 minutes for travel time.
- Representatives for older (age 14+) Scout programs (Explorer Posts, Sea Scouts, and Venture Crews) may be set up at an information table near the flagpole to answer questions about older Scout programs outside of the Scouts BSA (Troops) program.
- Troop locations differ from previous years so check the map (see page 8)
- Visitations for Packs are: Host Troop + 3 scheduled visitations + 2 optional free visitations.

## Program

Host Troops are encouraged to use free time to help visiting Scouts with rank requirements or Adventures if requested by the Den/Pack Unit Leaders. Any help provided goes a long way to encourage both Cub Scouts and their parents to continue in the Scouting program. There should be ample time during your Host visit time (9:30 – 10:30 am), the Open visit times (3:00 – 4:00 pm and 4:00 – 5:00 pm), and other times to help the Webelos and AoL Scouts should they need it. See the schedule on page 6.

## Arrival

Troops should arrive at Five Lakes Campground on Friday evening after 5:00 PM. Cracker Barrel will be at 9:00, Friday night, for each unit SPL, ASPL, SM, and one ASM at the Scout Hut. Please make sure that your campsite is ready for the Webelos and Arrow of Light (WAoL) Scouts arrival at 8:00 AM Saturday morning. There will be no formal check-in for the WAoL Scouts and Cub parents when they arrive Saturday morning. Each Troop should have a roster of whom to expect. After arriving, the Cub Scouts and their parents should set up in the Troop campsites and get ready for the flag ceremony. Some parents may have already decided which Troop they want to join and as such, won't go to the rotations. We are encouraging those parents to not arrive until after 3:30 pm. See the schedule on page 6.

## Responsibilities:

It is the Troop's responsibility to coordinate with a Webelos or AoL Den, or an entire Pack, to camp with the Troop. Troops who have not invited a Den or Pack should consult the Pack contact information on the District website under Units (<https://www.bsa-nashoba.org/copy-of-upcoming-events>) and contact one. Packs that have not been contacted by a Troop should seek out a Troop or contact the District Commissioner ([phillipdurocher@gmail.com](mailto:phillipdurocher@gmail.com)) for help. WAoL Scout parents are to bring their medical forms (Parts A and B) to Webelos Woods (see last pages of this document for Parts A & B).

Troops will be responsible for putting on an effective Troop activity during the Troop visitation rotations at their campsites which provides WAoL Scouts with a learning opportunity about some aspect of Scouting. Troop adults talk about Scouts BSA to the Cub parents while this activity is taking place. The Troop site activities should be informative and provide an engaging learning opportunity about some aspect of Scouting in a Troop. Please avoid a "show and tell" type of activity and instead make it hands-on that involves the Cub Scouts actively participating as they are led by the Troop's Scouts. This is an opportunity to motivate both WAoL Scouts (and their parents) to move forward into Scouts BSA. Please make sure your Scout activity(s) can accommodate as many as 20 (twenty) Cub Scouts at a time.

Each Scout Troop and guest Webelos/Arrow of Light Dens should prepare a skit for the Saturday evening campfire that will be fun. Your skit(s) must be appropriate to Scouting and

its values. Announcement of whom to contact to sign up for a skit will be made during Saturday morning announcements.

Troops will be responsible for all their own meals and communicating with the guest Dens/Packs camping with them regarding meal planning, costs, and expectations. Dens and Packs should communicate with their host Troops regarding any Adventures the Webelos/Arrow of Light Scouts need help completing. While it is not the host Troops responsibility to help WAoL Scouts earn Adventures, the Troops Scouts will certainly be willing to help. Discussion between the host Troop leadership and visiting Den/Pack leadership regarding any Adventures should happen prior to Webelos Woods.

At the end of the day, prior to the evening flag ceremony, all Scouts will gather at the main field to play a game. Details will be given at the Friday night Cracker Barrel. All Troops should have several older (14+) Scouts to help with the game.

## **Online Registration**

Registration will be done entirely online with registration starting 30 October and ending at 11:59 pm on 11 November 2019. Troops and Packs will each register separately as Units – each Troop will register, and each Pack will register - all participants must register with their respective unit. Specifically; Troops will not register Cub Scouts that are camping with them. It is advised not to wait until the last few days to register in the event that a problem arises with your registration. Cost is \$23 per Scout and \$23 per adult, with \$5 of that going to Five Lakes. While it may be possible for an individual to register for Webelos Woods apart from their unit, any individual registration will be considered invalid. As part of the online registration process, each Webelos or AoL Scout must choose which Troops to visit during the visitation rotations – listed as Time Blocks 2 – 4 both in the online registration and the schedule of events (see page 6). Please note there is a limit of 20 (twenty) visiting Scouts for each visitation rotation (Time Blocks), so if you are unable to register for a particular Time Block, please choose another. See Online Registration Details for specifics of using the online registration (page 9).

## Female Cub Scouts

Currently there is only one (1) female Scout Troop, 8720, which meets in Abita Springs. For female cub Scouts from the west side of Nashoba there will be a representative at the information table to talk about a potential female Troop in the Hammond area.

As such, Troop 8720 will have open visitations during all visitation periods and online registration is not required to visit Troop 8720 for any female Scouts. Female Webelos or AoL Scouts wishing to camp with Troop 8720 should contact them prior to Webelos Woods.

## Webelos Woods Rules

Please communicate the following camp rules to Scouts and parents:

- Buddy system (Scouts **and** adults) and two-deep leadership at all times (meaning adults cannot be alone with any Scout other than their own child).
- Bathrooms and Porta-Potties: Buddy system applies as well. For bathrooms, a Scout or adult must be posted outside since youth and adults are not allowed in the bathrooms at the same time.
- No vehicles in campsites (Troop trailers only allowed).
- Do not cross or climb on fences.
- Fires only in designated areas. Fire rings are to be left with ashes only; move all burnt (cold) wood to the tree line area (to make it easier to cut the grass).
- Do not use sinks in the Bath House for washing dishes.
- Use only toilet paper in Bath House. While additional toilet paper will be available at the Scout House, please make sure your Troop brings some.
- No alcoholic beverages, firearms, archery equipment or fireworks.
- Tobacco use in designated area only. This includes electronic cigarettes, personal vaporizers, or electronic nicotine delivery systems that simulate smoking.
- Plan to carry out trash and everything else you brought in. We will not have a dumpster available on property.

## Uniform

Field Uniforms ("Class A") should be worn during the morning flag ceremonies, the campfire program, and for the Scouts Own Service. Field Uniform is optional for the evening flag ceremony and what each Troop wears during the day is up to them.

## First Aid

Troops are required to have First Aid kits available at your campsite in the event of an accident. All participants, including Scouts and adults just visiting for the day, must bring a medical form for each participant.

## Online Registration Details

Online registration is done via the event webpage at [https://www.iacbsa.org/nb\\_web-wds\\_2019](https://www.iacbsa.org/nb_web-wds_2019). The 2019 Leaders Guide is posted there along with a 2019 Nashoba Cub Scout to Troops Transition Guide. Registration is done by unit and it is advisable to not wait until the last few days to register in the event you have a problem with your registration. Note that some web browsers are not well supported by the Council registration software (Internet Explorer being one – use Edge instead).






If you select **B – Youth (Webelos or AOL)**, the following confirmation screen appears.

Things to be aware of:

- The number of Time Blocks selections displayed will depend on your browser, and the display settings of your device (i.e., computer, phone, etc.) but certainly not all will be visible without scrolling down.
- Make sure you scroll down the page to be able to view all of the available Time Block selections
- The Troop listings are not in numerical order, but the Time Blocks: 2 is before Time Blocks: 3, with the Time Blocks: 4 listings last.
- You should also select **Host – Nashoba Web Wds – Your Host Troop** in Time Blocks: 1 in addition to your Troop visitation selections for Time Blocks 2 - 4
